Stop Trading on Congressional Knowledge (STOCK) Act of 2012: A Legislative History of Public Law No. 112-105 *Edited by William H. Manz*

The STOCK Act was intended to prevent members of Congress and all employees of the executive and judicial branches from using information derived from their official positions for personal profit.

Provisions of the Act requiring online disclosure of financial transactions were harshly criticized by federal government employee unions. Barely a year after passing the Act, citing security concerns, Congress unanimously passed an amendment removing the online disclosure provisions, an action considered by some to have effectively gutted the Act.

This compilation contains the text of the STOCK Act, bill versions, related bills, related hearings, Congressional Record materials, and presidential remarks. It also contains the documents relating to the quickly-enacted repeal of the disclosure provisions.
