Beginning with Chief Justice Warren Burger's first annual report in 1970, this important collection offers a historical overview of the accomplishments, as well as the needs and goals, of the federal judiciary, and is a valuable reference source of Supreme Court history.

Each year, the annual reports are used as a forum by the Chief Justice to detail the current condition of the federal judiciary through caseload statistics, committee accomplishments, and enacted (as well as pending) legislation that affects the courts. In addition, the annual reports provide a forum for a discussion of the management of the federal courts, providing all the issues that should be evaluated in the coming years.

The purpose of the topical overview is to provide the researcher with a convenient compilation of the most frequently addressed subjects found in many of the Chief Justices' annual reports.
