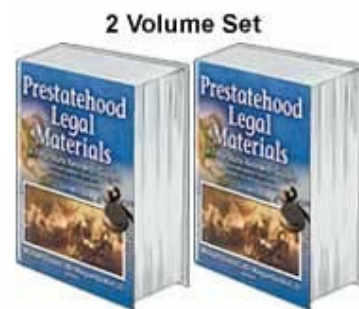

Resources that assist in locating not-so-easily accessible materials are also covered. Special sections focus on the legal resources of colonial New York City and Washington, DC— which is still technically in its prestatehood stage. Due to the enormity of this project, the editors of *Prestatehood Legal Materials* created a webpage where updates, corrections, additions and more will be posted.

In this comprehensive set you will find bibliographies, references, and discussion on a varied list of source materials including: state codes drafted by Congress; county, state, and national archives; journals and digests; state and federal reports, citations, surveys, and studies; books, manuscripts, papers, speeches, and theses; town and city records and documents; web sites to help you search for more information, and much more!
